

UNDERREPRESENTED NOTES

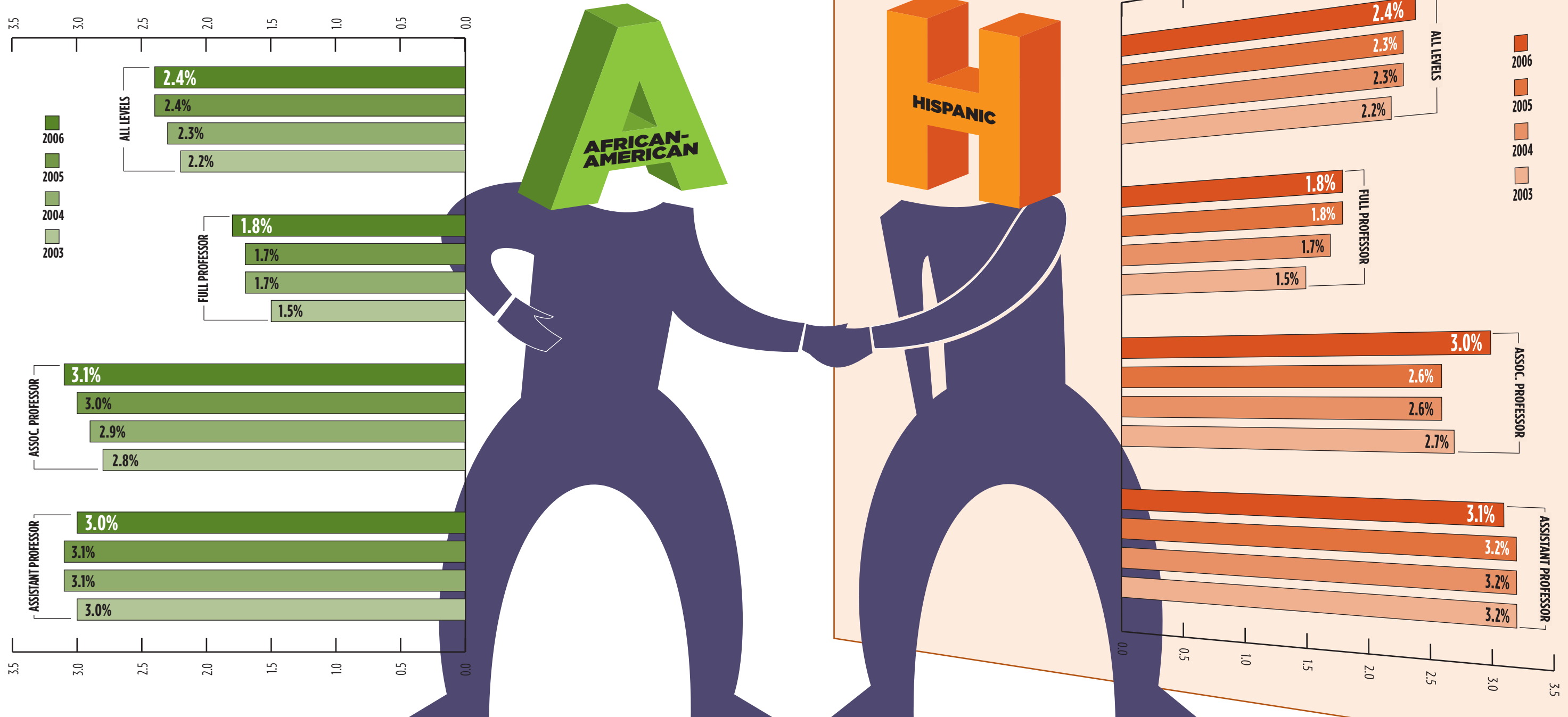
The percentage of African-American and Hispanic engineering faculty members has not changed much in recent years. Although the percentage of faculty members who are women increased from 8.9% in 2001 to 11.3% in 2006, the minorities listed below grew only from 2.1% to 2.4% of the total during the same period. African-Americans represent 12.3% of the total U.S. population, while Hispanics represent 12.5%.
